

From The Ghair

For those who may have missed the last newsletter, can I remind you of the new village websites. These are independent of the Parish Council site, and can be found at:

We particularly want to ensure that the business details are as up to date as possible – there are lots of people working and trading within the village, and a lot of local resource that can be made use of if it's known about. Please contact the Parish Clerk (clerk@kimptonpc.org.uk) with any updates or additions.

I will also repeat the early notice of a meeting for the coordinators of all the various village events, which will take place on 22nd January 2018 at 19:00 in the Memorial Hall Green Room. This worked well last year, and enables organisations to plan, pool resources and avoid duplication of effort. Put it in your diary, if you are an event organiser, and there will be more information nearer the time.

Preparations are well under way for the inaugural Christmas Market, running between 14:00 and 20:00 on Saturday 2nd December on The Green.

There will be craft stalls (in tepees, in case of 'weather'!) and music and refreshments and a range of other suitably seasonal activities for all the family.

You may recall that we regularly raise the topic of traffic in the village, and we recently undertook to put together a working party to complement the existing DriveSafe initiatives, and to enable us to apply some pressure to address the concerns of residents.

We wrote to Peter Lilley on more than one occasion, to lobby for legislation forcing commercial vehicles to have commercial satnav systems on UK roads. Although this would probably not keep them off the High Street (which is a designated B road) it ought to keep them out of the lanes to Harpenden,

which would be a bonus.

However, the response from Chris Grayling, the Transport Secretary, was that "the Parish Council may wish to raise this issue with Hertfordshire County Council, to ascertain if traffic signs are appropriate to ensure HGVs only use appropriate routes" – a response that any resident will appreciate is next to useless, as there are plenty of signs already.

I raised this issue again this week with our new MP, Bim Afolami, so we will see if any further movement takes place on this, but it doesn't look as if there is any appetite for a statutory intervention.

The response to my earlier request for people to join a working party to look at traffic problems was not met by an overwhelming response, so if anyone is interested, please contact the Clerk.

On other matters, we have once again



resurfaced the access road to the Parkfield Sports Ground Car Park, and have liaised with the bin collection teams to ensure that they keep speeds to a minimum, and so far they appear to be sticking to that. We hope that, with careful use buy the

heavy traffic, the surface will prove to be more durable.

Dacre Rooms Kimpton are a Village Community Hub

More than two years have passed since a small group of committed people decided to revive the little used Dacre Rooms. Since May 2015 Dacre Rooms has been able to pay its way and undertake some essential restoration work, for example, new central heating and replacement windows. Thanks to The Bench Working Party a huge number of small repairs have been completed in the building. More than one hundred volunteers have run events at the rooms, fundraising for village clubs and the Dacre Rooms.

In 2016 nearly 5000 people visited the building for coffee mornings, lunches, evening meals, farmers markets, craft and art events, yoga and private parties. In April this year the High Sheriff of Hertfordshire, William Hobhouse, visited Dacre Rooms to meet many of the volunteers who use the building.

More recently, the committee has received a capital grant that will enable the toilets, utility room and ground floor to receive a much-needed refurbishment. There are still many small revenue projects to be completed and for these fund raising continues. Working closely with the original youth club trustees a new charity for Dacre Rooms is currently being established with new trustees.

We look forward to a time when The White Horse will once again take up its position in providing a hub for our enjoyment at the centre of our wonderful village.

Kimpton Folk Events

I hope you had the opportunity to enjoy the 2017 Kimpton Folk Festival. I am pleased to report that it was another hugely successful event, with attendances up around 30% on the inaugural year. We estimate the overall numbers this year at just over 1000 people and we're expecting attendances to grow yet again in 2018. The happy challenge facing our forward planning group is how to manage the increasing popularity of our festival. Who knows how things might develop?

Our community model is proving enormously popular, as evidenced by the large crowds on the Green who had the opportunity to enjoy many of our headline acts along with great food, local ales and a ceilidh. All concerts this year were well attended and it is fair to say that 'Sam Kelly & The Lost Boys' - our headline act for 2017 - went down an absolute storm.

As per last year, there were instrumental workshops in The Dacre Rooms, Morris dancing, and sets by Kimpton's own musicians. New to the festival this year were 'busk stops' featuring a range of local artists, an expanded all-day session in The Boot, a larger range of children's activities and performances on the Green by local community choirs.

As we move forward to our third year, our vision remains the same - to stage a 'whole village' event which opens up the folk music genre to local audiences and brings new opportunities for new and emerging talent to perform alongside established stars.

The festival itself now comes under the auspices of newly formed Charitable Trust 'Kimpton Folk Events'. As well as staging local events, this charity seeks to promote and grow the folk arts in the wider community and to that end we are now actively exploring a range of exciting possibilities in this area. 

Roger and Out!


As reported in the previous edition of this magazine, Roger Nash has retired as Chairman of the Hall's Management Committee and handed the baton over to Simon Thompson.

Please ensure that your computer is loaded with the latest security software to avoid attack by cyber

criminals. Don't get involved with callers claiming to represent a Computer Software Technical Support Team using the name of a company like Microsoft or Talktalk saying you have a problem which they can put right if you give them certain details. Once again, don't get involved!

Distraction Burglaries

Please keep an eye on the elderly and those living alone who need to be advised to be extremely wary of and challenge unexpected callers on their doorstep and if they can't provide identity evidence don't open the door.

Always ring the police on 101 to report your suspicions and for reassurance.

If the caller is persistent and/or aggressive ring 999 immediately.

I make no apology for repeating this message and request you to be kind enough to check on elderly, vulnerable and neighbours living alone and in particular remind them not to engage in conversation with any dubious phone caller or doorstep visitor. If in any doubt tell them to put the phone down and then call 101 immediately.

Make your property looks 'lived in' if possible by parking a vehicle on the drive.and installing timer operated security lights. If your absence is more than a few days give a neighbour your contact details.
