Easter - a time for the start of a new life

We're all living through tough and treacherous times. We think Covid is beginning to melt away—and the fires of our fears are stoked up by soaring infection numbers! We think we're done with Brexit –only to discover even more red tape rules about travelling and trading with the EU than there were ever wonky bananas and cucumbers! We think we live in prosperous times—and we are shocked by the multitude of new and increased tax hikes! We believed we lived in peace—and we are stunned by the awful

atrociousness of the atrocities of the Russian invasion of Ukraine!

Nevertheless, Easter is still worth celebrating because it is all about new life. Not about old life—how we used to be—what we used to put up with—but about new life and abundant life and fulfilled life. Suddenly we have looked up from our Covid, Brexit, increased costs of living woes and seen new life bursting out everywhere in nature. Spring has arrived. What is more the villages are daring to live life to the full again—May Festival is on. Kimpton and Ayot St Lawrence Art Shows will be happening. Noise project will go ahead. No more cancelled holidays or weddings.

Easter brings the chance to start again. There are 2 million displaced persons and 3-4 million Ukrainian refugees at the moment. Their situation is tough and treacherous. They are stunned and horrified by the Russian invasion of their country. Mostly women and children, they are having to start life all over again. A new and shockingly different and changed life. By 20th March, 58,000 Ukrainians applied to enter the UK to go to family members. It is shaming and treacherous indeed that only 9,000 visas to enter the UK had been issued by 20th March—that's less than the number of illegal immigrants landing on the Kent coast in 4 months. It would be the least we could do to help these war refugees to have the chance to start again with their families.

At Kimpton & Ayot St Lawrence Churches we have considered what practical help we might realistically be able to give war refugees to help them have the chance to begin a new life again. We have no suitable house to house a Ukrainian family, have negligible or no public transport and shortly no primary healthcare as Bridge House satellite surgery in Kimpton closes. The Church council decided our most effective action was to continue to raise funds for the Disaster Emergency Committee Humanitarian Aid for Ukraine. We will build on the £600+ raised at the last Dacre Rooms Coffee morning hosted by Kimpton church and use all the events over the Easter Weekend to raise more money.

Come to the Good Friday Hot Cross Bun café and make a donation. If you don't come to church at any other time, come to church at Easter and make a donation. Please help give Ukrainian war refugees that chance to begin a new life.

The Ukrainian Orthodox Church and Russian Orthodox Church celebrate Easter a week or so after the Church of England. This year that is 24th April. We pray with our Christian brothers and sisters in the Ukraine that Easter will bring the chance to start again for them. Let us all pray for a speedy declaration of a lasting peace with Russia. An end to loss of life. And pray that there will be the beginning of a new life that will be an abundant life filled with peace.

I wish you all a blessed and peaceful Easter. God bless Rev'd Linda Williams

Leslie 'Bill' Symonds

Bill Symonds of Commons Lane, was born in February 1930 and lived his long and contented life, mostly (with the exception of National Service) within 3 miles of Kimpton. Bill was one of twins—he was Leslie Allan and his twin Allan Leslie—which explains the name Bill. He worked at Vauxhalls on the night shifts for a while. He married June and their family was completed by their two girls. Bill passed away in the Lister Hospital on 5th January aged 91. His funeral was at Harwood Park Crematorium on 31st January 2022.

Margaret Kerr Loader

Originally from Glasgow, Margaret's parents and brother were moved to Wembley in 1940 for war work. Margaret retrained to be a teacher in 1970, becoming deputy headmistress before retirement. Her interests included badminton and she coached the England team. She ran cycling proficiency classes which she felt was very important. Margaret married John and they had 44 happy years together—26 of them spent in Lawn Avenue, Kimpton. Between them John and Margaret had six children, eight grandchildren and 2 great grandchildren. Margaret battled cancer for three years. She passed away on 18th January at home in Lawn Avenue aged 88 years. Her funeral was at Harwood Park Crematorium on 15th February 2022

Dennis Clarke

The interment of ashes for the late Dennis Clarke of Blackmore End, whose funeral was held in August 2021, took place on 15th February 2022 in Kimpton Churchyard.

Colin Ward

Colin was born in 1931 and grew up in Kimpton. His parents were Tom, the tailor, and Drusilla Ward and his grandfather Samuel Ward was baker and landlord of the White Horse in the early years of the 20th century. Tom was part of a large family who lived on and around The Green. Colin worked at ICI at Kimpton Hoo, but then did National Service during the Anti–British National Liberation War in Malaya. Colin spent much of his working life as a herdsman looking after the cattle at Norfolk College of Agriculture (now Easton College) near Norwich and to give on-thejob training to a new generation of herdsmen and women. Later he became a landscape gardener. He was married to Anne Williamson, (who predeceased him in 2007), for 43 years. Colin died in 2021. He is survived by his three sones and daughter and five grandchildren who carried out his wish for his ashes to be interred at Kimpton with his parents on what would have been his 91st birthday-8th March 2022.

It's your Church-you don't want to lose it—so come along and use it!

I was talking to the man who came to spray the Vicarage carpets for moths and beetles the other day. He was astonished to learn that if you were christened (at whatever age—babe or grown up) in a church, that gave you the right to be married there. The moth man said--to quote Michael Caine 'not a lot of people know that.' So, I'm going to tell you about it. If you were christened, confirmed, went to Sunday school or even were in a Brownie or Guide pack that regularly attended Sunday church—you can get married in that church.

What am I saying is—plan for the future. Come and have your babes, children, godparents, adults christened at Kimpton or Ayot St Lawrence church. We can fit you into a Sunday morning service several times a year or on an afternoon (thought that's likely to be without music or singing).

It is your right as English citizens to be christened, married and have your funeral and be buried in their local C of E church. Everyone resident in Kimpton, Blackmore End, Peters Green, Ayot St Lawrence and anywhere in these parishes qualifies.

What's more, compared to civil services for weddings and funerals, it can be cheaper. Just ask me about costs. Christenings are free—what I like to call God's free gift.

I meet a lot of people in Kimpton and Ayot St Lawrence who tell me how they used to come to church or used to attend Sunday school, were in the choir or rang bells. Let's be honest, a few voices may have broken, or you grew out of Sunday school or football got scheduled for Sunday morning, or you had a run in with the Vicar or just didn't like them much. (Well, this Vicar is not like that!). Lately Covid-19 has been the reason folks have stopped coming to church—in order to keep safe. But even so, like the Windmill Theatre during the 1940 Blitz – we never closed either Kimpton or Ayot St Lawrence churches in 2021. People stop going to church for all sorts of reasons.

This Vicar wants you to think again about coming to church. This time of the year is really good for giving church a go. For a start it's warmer weather! There's Easter time too—Palm Sunday, palm crosses for everyone and a dramatized version of the Easter story. Free hot cross buns at the Dacre Rooms, children's Easter gardens competition, a lovely walk from Peter's Green Cross raising ceremony to Kimpton church all on Good Friday. Easter Day's main 9.30am church is all about the good bits, the happy ending in Jesus' story—his coming back to life so that we can have eternal life. More Easter gardens, flowery crosses, an outdoor trail and songs you've heard of that are old favourites to sing.

All this is quickly followed by May Festival and Kimpton Church Art Show with outdoor songs of praise. You get to choose the songs we sing on the day. Ayot St Lawrence Church Art Show is in June. Pet blessing services at both churches in July. Oh! and there are weddings all through June and July at Kimpton this year—so get booked in quick if you are thinking of a church wedding or christening....just ask me if you want to know what's possible. I aim to please!

Whilst we still have two beautiful, picturesque, (for the photos) historic, unique Grade one listed churches that folks rave about in our villages, church going has changed and the Vicar's mission is to make you smile as you give church another go. It's your church—you don't want to lose it—so come along and use it!

How do we maintain our Parish Church?

Have you ever wondered how life would be in Kimpton without our beautiful church? A dilapidating ruin which greets you on the skyline as you drive in from Codicote. Hardly a fitting advertisement for our wonderful village though, happily, we do not envisage this happening in our lifetime! But how is the building maintained?

Our parish church is of course primarily used

by many to worship God every Sunday. But what about those people and their families who have been baptised, married, and, sadly, buried there? Who would miss candlelit carols at Christmas, the joy of Easter services (and Easter egg hunts!) in the spring, and the Armistice parade in November? How else would you hear the sound of bells ringing out over our village? Or where would you go for somewhere quiet to pray, reflect or meditate? What about the other roles that our church building fulfils within our Kimpton community? The book stall / puzzle swap corner which provided such great comfort for many of us during lockdown. The terrific venue it provides for our annual art show, great acoustics for the folk festival, and a fitting location for the food table at the back of the church organised for the benefit of less fortunate villagers by the amazing people of "Kimpton Cares". And then there's the history and aesthetic beauty of the building itself which contributes to the character and architecture of our village.

And yet nearly 1,000 churches have been decommissioned within Britain over the past 30 years with the rate of closure accelerating. Over 420 churches were shut in the past decade and the same number is expected to close in the next 5 years. Could our parish church be one of them? Certainly, without the commitment of all those people who have served on the Kimpton Parish Church Restoration Trust ("KPCRT"), it is entirely possible that our church of St Peter and St Paul could have become another closure statistic.

A church has stood on the current site since the 12th century with the pillars and arches of the nave dating from c1200 AD. Now grade 1 listed and built largely of flint embedded in lime mortar, our church requires constant maintenance. Ancient buildings are expensive to maintain which is why KPCRT was set up in April 1984 as a registered charity with the sole aim of funding maintenance and restoration work on the church's fabric. The cost of essential work has historically been met from the Trust's own fundraising activities, donations from individuals, and grants from national organisations and locally organised events, notably the Kimpton May Festival and the Art Show for which we are hugely grateful. But with events unable to take place recently due to covid, and grants from national organisations (notably English Heritage) becoming ever more scarce, our income streams have dried up.

To put matters into context, the cost of maintaining the church since the Trust's formation has run into hundreds of thousands of pounds with much of that raised from English Heritage. But with that source of funding no longer available, KPCRT is now obliged to finance repairs from its own fund raising activities. The building needs constant attention in the form of extensive inspections every 5 years by a specialised architect with the cost of any maintenance work met by the Trust. The last architect's inspection took place in 2017 and resulted in KPCRT scheduling required work in two phases. Phase 1 was completed a couple of years ago when significant repairs were made to the main body of the church.

from page 5 Phase 2 should commence this September with the erection of scaffolding around the tower to undertake some necessary stone work and the repainting of the clock. Meanwhile the next architect's five yearly inspection is due imminently. We cannot know at this stage what that will reveal save that, in a constant cycle of required maintenance, it's likely that KPCRT will be presented with a further schedule of works to be completed over the next five years. And then there is always the risk of an unforeseen, urgent structural problem.

We remain hugely indebted to all those people and organisations who have donated to KPCRT in the past. But, to keep our church as a safe and important village asset, we remain reliant on the support of our local community. Could you help? If so, we'd love to hear from you.

Queen's Platinum Jubilee 70 Acts of Kimpton Kindness

You may have heard of this initiative for Queen Elizabeth's Jubilee Year.

The idea is for communities to help each other with small jobs for people—and to try to achieve 70 jobs during the year of the Jubilee. So in Kimpton, we're going to try to achieve that in Kimpton between now and the 70th anniversary of Her Majesty's coronation June 2023. This is a collaboration between Kimpton Church including the Noise Project and the Village Bench Working Party.

The idea is to perform small acts of kindness that might make a big difference to someone's daily life. Those acts of kindness are

to be doing jobs for people that they cannot do on their own for whatever reason. Such as: - facilitate access/safety to their home/garden for them.

The emphasis is on-

Small and specific, ie, not 'gardening' or 'decorating'
Realistic and achievable, ie, not complex/expensive & within skills set of people offering
Time bound tasks ie, to take not more than one session of 1- 2hours or a morning.

Here a few general examples of acts of kindness
Garden maintenance such as trim low short hedge, weed small border, trim few shrubs.

mow small lawn, clear small pond.

Minor DIY such as level rocky paving slab or two, creosoting short fence length/bench/shed or similar. Small repairs.

There are some things which are outlawed for Health & Safety/Safeguarding reasons:

No working at height

No disposal of rubbish, garden cuttings etc.

No working with chemicals

Preferably out of doors acts of kindness

Nothing a professional tradesperson should be required for.

Let's achieve 70 Acts of Kimpton Kindness together.

Councillors wanted!

It's election year in Kimpton, with Parish Council Election taking place on Thursday 5th May. I'd like to thank the councillors who are stepping down for their commitment in serving our local community, and for all the improvements to the parish we've made over the last four years. We're now actively looking for new volunteers to join the council, so if you're interested in finding out more, please contact our parish clerk, Carina, (clerk@kimptonpc.org.uk), myself or one of my fellow councillors. You need to be at least 18 years old to stand, and elections are for a four-year term.

All nomination papers need to be submitted to North Herts District Council (NHDC) by 4pm on Tuesday 5th April. If required, the council can also arrange delivery of your nomination form to NHDC to save you the trip.

Statutory Consultation now open on the proposed expansion of London Luton Airport On Tuesday 8 February, Luton Rising, the owners of London Luton Airport, opened a new statutory consultation on its long-term proposals to expand the airport.

The consultation runs until 4 April. The proposal is to increase the capacity of the airport to 32 million passengers per year, by building a new terminal and making better use of the existing runway. Pre-pandemic, 18 million passengers used the terminal each year, so the proposed increase is significant.

At the time of writing, the council has yet to formally consider its response, as it will do so at the Parish Council Meeting on 23 March 2022. However, regardless of the council's view, I would urge all residents to learn about the proposals and have their say as part of the consultation.

There is also a community group called LADACAN which represents people affected by the noise from Luton Airport and concerned about its growing impacts on climate change and on local quality of life. It has provided some excellent guidance on the process and outlined how it plans to respond. Please visit https://ladacan.org/ to find out more.

And remember, the consultation closes on 4 April 2022.



Hedge planting at Parkfield Sports Ground

As many of you will have seen, work on renewing the hedgerow at Parkfield Sports Ground has commenced. I'm delighted to report Kimpton has secured 1,000 trees through the NHDC free trees giveaway scheme, which will be planted as a new native hedgerow. These are mixed species of



hawthorn, hazel, downy birch, silver birch, field maple, whitebeam, lime, rowan, wild cherry and bird cherry.

from page 8 We appreciate that the area looks a little sparse after the clearance works, but this renewed hedge will be a fantastic host to wildlife and create biodiversity in the coming years. In many ways, it is a community legacy project for the benefit of future generations.

On Friday 11 March we also planted seven crab apple trees, as part of The Queen's Green Canopy. This is a unique tree planting initiative created to mark Her Majesty's Platinum Jubilee in 2022 which invites people from across the United Kingdom to "Plant a Tree for the Jubilee".

We planted seven – to mark each decade of the Queen's service – and chose to do it on the 70th day of 2022. It was a true community project, with the Eco Team from Kimpton Primary School joining forces with the Bench Working Party and Kimpton Parish Council to plant the trees. We're pleased with the size of the saplings and hope that they will establish quickly.

New outdoor fitness equipment on order for the Recreation Ground

New outdoor fitness equipment is on order for the lower level of the Recreation Ground, following a request from some residents earlier this year. This will be installed week commencing 9th May, after this year's May Festival.

This follows hot on the heels of the recent upgrades to the play equipment, with the see-saw being replaced with a new Double Perch and a Tic Tac Toe panel.

The next phase will be to review the current usage and possible future plans for the Pavilion.



10 Years of Kimpton Touch Rugby

Kimpton Rugby club will be celebrating 10 years of touch rugby in Kimpton on the afternoon of the Thursday 2nd June bank holiday at the Recreation Ground. There will be touch rugby games between various sports teams in the village.

The first touch rugby game in the village was played on 29th March 2012 with 18 people turning up. Since then there have been games every week, except when cancelled due to a wet pitch or Covid. In the winter there are usually 14-16 players and in the summer it is 20-24, split into two teams and either playing on the football pitch or on the bottom practice area.

After playing informally for 4 years, the club was formally established in 2016 to take over the lease of the ground and clubhouse. Since then we have been responsible for managing the facilities. The football pitch is used on Sunday mornings by the Kimpton Football club and now the youth teams from Wheathampstead Wanderers. Knebworth Women's team have had their first season based at the ground, playing on Sunday afternoons, and will be back next season.

We pool the resources of the clubs to invest in the facilities, and last summer the rugby club and women's team repainted the club house with paint provided by the council. Kimpton FC and Wheathampstead Wanderers also help maintain the facility for the use of all the village.

The club plays every Thursday evening at 7:30pm. The rules are simple and the games are not scored. However, they are still competitive and great exercise. It is a social group with many going onto The Boot after a game.

Firstly a good news story about Kimpton Neighbourhood Watch to inspire and encourage others to register.

We have a volunteer Neighbourhood Watch Co-ordinator who has an impressive 43 years' service and has now retired as the head of Kimpton Ward but remains an active member. Alan Smith was a founder member of the Kimpton NHW in 1977 as deputy Street Co-ordinator for Dacre Crescent. Jock White, his neighbour, was the Street Co-ordinator and the driving force behind the scheme assisted by Hitchin police who were generous with their support.

At that time, four deputies each liaised with 10 properties distributing information from Hitchin police about local crimes by telephone or by visiting their neighbours personally. A labour of love!

By 1980, three other street schemes were active and with Jock's persuasive powers, four years later, almost every street in the area was part of NHW.

Fast forward a few years to 2002, Alan became the Area Co-ordinator. Hitchin Rural PCSO Heather Burrows said: "I've known Alan Smith for 11 years. In that time, we have worked closely together. He is one of the most generous, kindest men I know. Always keen to help and always does it with a smile. He is, and hopefully will continue to be, one of my favourite tea stops."

Alan said: "I've really enjoyed being part of NHW and have seen the real benefits. The origins go back to the 70's and the initiative of a few community minded residents and police officers from Hitchin Police Station. The arrival of police crime and security messages from OWL has been a real boon. However, not all properties have registered on OWL so we also publish a NHW update in the quarterly parish magazine which is delivered to every property in the village."

From the Kimpton villagers and those in the surrounding wards we thank you Alan for your amazing service. You have set a very high bar! We are pleased to say we now have two new Ward Coordinators for Kimpton, John Bowers and Angus Davidson. You may have noticed that there are new and upgraded yellow NHW signs installed around the village.

The brilliant OWL (Online Watch Link) messaging service was launched in 2006 with now over 350 houses in Kimpton signed up. We would urge you, if not yet registered on OWL, to do so. The more of us that are aware of the system, the email updates it issues and the useful information on the system, the better for us all. There are some weeks when there is only one thing to write about. This time it's Ukraine. The crimes being committed in eastern Europe now in 2022 remind me of scenes that we last saw in the era of the Cold War; I fear that we are returning to such a Cold War world in Europe, and we must adapt accordingly.

For the first time in generations, a foreign army has invaded a European sovereign state. Vladimir Putin, Russia's president, has sent in troops to topple the democratic regime and take control of the country. Many lives have been lost already, with shelling intensifying on urban centres and cities where millions of people nobly resist Russian ground forces.

I am grateful for the many messages I have received from constituents in support of Ukraine. This war will impact us here the UK in many ways – food and energy prices will undoubtedly rise. Local farmers that I have

met recently are very concerned about grain supplies from Eastern Europe to feed our livestock and bake our bread.

The humanitarian crisis has begun to unfold. The images of people fleeing their homes to save their families are heart-breaking. Leaving home without knowing if or when there will be peace to return, is a harrowing reality. These refugees will need places to stay, possibly many miles from their own homes.

What can we do to help? Other than the military apparatus we are providing through our NATO partners, we must also enforce punitive sanctions against Russia. This means depriving Putin and his cronies of money stolen from the Russian people. Putin has taken the wealth of a great nation and ferreted it abroad hidden and disguised in off-shore shell companies and through property and business interests here in the UK. This money should be paying for the healthcare and education of Russian people, but it is now funding the very bombs dropping on hospitals and schools in cities across Ukraine. I welcome the Economic Crimes Bill that was speedily brought through the House of Commons in a single day to be given Royal Assent this week.

We must also play our full part in taking refugees from Ukraine. Last week I met with the Prime Minister and emphasised the feeling that has been expressed to me by constituents in Hitchin & Harpenden that the UK needs to do as much as possible to support Ukrainian refugees. These are people fleeing war – their homes and livelihoods destroyed by one man's neo-imperial ambitions – and we must stand by them.

The Minister for Safe and Legal Migration has updated Parliament on the measures the Government is taking to expedite applications. I am pleased to confirm that staff have been surged to key visa application centres across Europe, particularly Poland, and more biometric kit has been moved to support them. Supporting this work from the UK, the Home Office has put casework teams on standby to process applications to prevent delays. We have increased the capacity at those Centres to 13,000 appointments per week.

The situation is developing quickly, and so the Government must evolve its plans to adapt. I welcome the expansive Ukrainian Family Scheme which allows family members of British nationals, UK settled persons and certain others to come or stay in the UK. Furthermore, I warmly welcome the launch of the new 'Homes for Ukraine' scheme which will allow individuals, charities, community groups and businesses in the UK to bring Ukrainians to safety - including those with no family ties with the UK. I understand that individual sponsors will be asked to provide homes or a spare room rent-free for as long as they are able, with a minimum stay of six months. In return, they will receive £350 per month.

We cannot stand by and watch Putin succeed. Ukraine is a sovereign democratic state; it needs and deserves our support. What happens there will have a lasting impact on our lives here. We must do all we can.
