

#### Kings, May Queens and Coronations

2023 is shaping up to be the year of the party. Simply masses of major happenings all excuses for partying. And lots of different parties at that.

The monarchy has gone all post-modern! Our newish oldish King Charles III has sent out 'save the date' invites and is having a mock-up of Westminster Abbey made at home, so he can practice in the robes—I well know how important that is, as does every bride too—disastrous to trip over your hems—and he's going to be balancing the equivalent of a jewellery box on his head! I do hope the royals have a really good giggle doing all that rehearsing. Made in the Middle East from olive oils, mixed with herbs and natural perfumes, churches have been blessing and using Holy Oils since before 390CE. In this Diocese, a special church service to bless the Oils takes place at St Albans Abbey on Maundy Thursday each year. All Clergy and Readers are required to attend and renew their ministry vows that day. Three different oils are blessed: the first is for the anointing of the sick; the second for anointing those being christened. The third, 'Chrism' is a mix of oil and balsam used to anoint at Confirmation. Every church has one of each oil. As I say at every christening --the anointed child is up there with royalty—now you know why!

Jesus was at a dinner party one night when his feet were anointed with the equivalent of a giant bottle of Chanel No. 5-what a wonderful aroma must have filled the room. Jesus also provided 850 bottles of wine at another party he went to. I'm sure Jesus liked a party! Celebrate Jesus' last dinner party with his friends on Maundy Thursday with us. We recall the events of that last night—lamb casserole dinner, washing feet, breaking bread together, a walk in the garden, his arrest and trial. On Good Friday come and have a Hot Cross Bun in the Dacre Rooms. Children can enter the Easter Garden making competition.

Celebrate the crowning of the King of kings on Easter Day! The resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ!! Join in with a fun church service at 6am —out of doors if the weather is kind where we'll be fire starting. Afterwards an eggy breakfast is planned. At 9.30am you are invited to Holy Communion for Easter. Bring a flower to decorate the bare church cross as a symbol of resurrection to new life. Winners of the Easter Garden competition will be rewarded with the traditional calorie laden oval things and I heard a rumour there's an Easter egg hunt too.

But before all those parties, there's the biggest Kimpton Village party of all—and another coronation. I'm sure you are all looking forward to May Festival on the weekend before the King's Coronation. Our May Queen and her attendants will be enthroned and she'll be ceremoniously crowned. I wonder if she's like to go the whole nine yards and be anointed too?

Whatever and how ever many parties you have lined up for this Summer, I hope you have a wonderful and blessed Easter time 2023 to kick them off.

Margaret had a son and daughter and grandchildren-though she was the last of her own family of five siblings. She was buried, as she wished, next to her sister Lilian Saunders.

#### **CONFIRMATION-** what it is and when it is

Want to be confirmed by the first female bishop of Hertford? In your very own village church? There will be a service of Confirmation at Kimpton Church next May 10<sup>th</sup> 7.30pm.

The brand-new shiny Bishop of Hertford, Jane Mainwaring will be leading it. It doesn't happen very often that your own village church

gets the chance to hold such a service. So, if you would like to be baptised and confirmed or just confirmed in May in your very own village church, please read on......

- 1. A lot of people get christened or baptised (they're the same thing), and confirmed and 2,000 years ago they went together in a oner. But when it caught on and everyone wanted their babies baptised, it wasn't possible for the Bishops to be everywhere at once so a separate service of Confirmation, usually when you were older, grew up.
- 2. Confirmation is, literally, you confirming the promises that someone else made for you when you were a baby or small child. You confirm your faith in God and the Bishop Confirms you in your Christian faith.
- 3. To mark this special moment, Bishop places his hands on your head (lightly!) and your hands are anointed with chrism oil. This special stuff signifies the gifts of the Holy Spirit. It reminds us of how Christ himself was anointed with the Holy Spirit.
- 4. Confirmation is not a made-up C of E thing. It takes place all over the Christian world and in every Christian denomination. It is scriptural --found in Acts and in Hebrews parts of the New Testament. In Hebrew chapter 6 verse 2 it talks about the laying on of hands and presence of the Holy Spirit.
- 5. You can be any age. It's a one-time deal and admits you to having bread and wine at the service of Holy Communion. (ps. Can swing the school place too!)
- 6. You get to choose the hymns for the service and there will be cake afterwards!

There are a few weeks of chatting and answering your questions about God, Church and what it all means to prepare. These are an hour or so and start on 22<sup>nd</sup> March 2023 7.30pm at 11 High Street Kimpton. You don't have to be a regular attender at church. If interested, please contact the Rector who can give you much more detail on preparation and what's involved. There are already a few folks interested, so don't worry about being on your own. Just call 01438 833348.





#### Dogs running loose on public land

The parish council has received complaints from residents that they are seeing dogs not under control at the Recreation Ground and Parkfield Sports Ground. Owners are exercising their dogs by throwing balls and allowing their dogs to damage new hedging plants in the chase of a ball. More dog fouling is being experienced in these grounds, particularly unacceptable in the children's play areas.

Please could all dog owners keep their dogs on a lead in these public recreation areas.





#### An update from District Councillor Cllr Ralph Muncer

Firstly, I wish to pay tribute to my predecessor, John Bishop who sadly died in early March. John served Kimpton as our District Councillor for 16 years and always demonstrated a strong spirit of service and commitment to residents throughout that period. I know his loss will be felt by many in our community and my thoughts and prayers are with his family at this difficult time.



Prior to the new financial year, the focus of both Central and Local Government is to pass a budget for the coming year.

Whilst it may not be as coveted as the Chancellor of the Exchequer standing up in the House of Commons, Budget Debates at local authorities such as North Hertfordshire District Council are equally important as they determine how our money is spent on local services.

Unfortunately, as a result of the Budget adopted by the current administration, residents across the District will be paying more and getting less for their money.

Council Tax is to be increased by 2.99%, the Garden Waste Charge will be increased by nearly 25% and Car Parking fees in Town Centres will also see an increase.

Despite increasing the amount residents will pay to NHDC, members of the Administration deemed it appropriate to increase Councillor Allowances by 6%, something which I voted against.

I will continue to voice my opposition to the impending cuts to our waste collections, which will result in bins being collected every three weeks, with the potential for monthly collections in the future. In my opinion, this is a clear example of the Council neglecting its statutory responsibilities. I have argued this cut, which apparently will save £270,000, should be reversed and the Council ought to make savings and efficiencies elsewhere within its £18.5 million budget.

My firm believe is that Local Government should focus on providing high quality statutory services which deliver residents with good value for money and I will continue to advocate for this in the Council Chamber.

#### Delivering better local healthcare services

You have told me that securing better local healthcare services for our communities is one of our top priorities. I have been working with your local District Councillor Ralph Muncer to make sure that we deliver that for Kimpton – with a particular focus on cutting waiting times, improving access to healthcare in rural communities, and delivering two new specialist hospitals (one treating cancer, one for children) serving our region

We recently visited the Lister Hospital in Stevenage as part of a wider listening exercise I am doing, meeting staff at local hospitals and GP surgeries to get their views on how we can support them to deliver a better service. These are some of my immediate takeaways:

First, it is clear that we need more capacity in the system to deal with both short term and long-term pressures.

Second, despite our efforts in increasing the number of doctors by 14% and the number of nurses by 11% over the last three years, morale is not as high as anybody would like it to be. We must redouble our efforts to engage closely with the NHS workforce, ensuring that policy remains in line with the feeling on the front line.

Third, there is an increased challenge for GP surgeries in delivering face-to-face appointments post-pandemic and we need to ensure that they have the support and capacity necessary to facilitate this.

I am taking up the points that local NHS staff have raised to me with Ministerial colleagues and seeking to ensure that they have all the support that they need to improve local services and cut waiting times.

As part of my work in this area, I really value the thoughts and feedback of local residents – sharing your experiences of local healthcare. Each month I do a monthly survey and in March I am surveying residents on this subject. But though small in size, the festival is big in ambition, and the line-up for this year's event [on Saturday, July 1] is arguably the best yet, packed with shining stars of the folk universe.



A number of top acts are returning by popular demand, including **Urban Folk Quartet**, **Sam Kelly and Jamie Francis** and Kimpton Festival's patrons, **Nancy Kerr and James Fagan**. Among those new to Kimpton will be the hugely talented musician and singer **Phil Beer**, best known as one-half of the legendary Show of Hands, and acclaimed singer-songwriter **Reg Meuross** 

Other great acts taking part include **Emily Slade**, **Edwina Hayes**, mother-and-daughter duo **Belinda Kempster and Fran Foote**, **Doug Eunson and Sarah Matthews**, and **Holly Clarke**.

As last year, the concert times are being staggered, so anyone buying an afternoon or all-day ticket will be able to catch every minute of the action.



But the ticketed concerts in The Church and Memorial Hall are only part of what Kimpton Folk Festival has to offer. Anyone who has attended previous events will know that it is a great day out for all the family. As in past years there will be a full afternoon of free music and dance on The Green, starting with Kimpton Village Choir and ending with a raucous knees-up to a ceilidh band. There will be a wide range of entertainment for children of all ages on Garden Fields, music workshops in the Dacre Rooms, sessions and other entertainment in The Boot and buskers wherever you turn. Add to that, craft and food stalls, face-painting and a fine selection of locally brewed ales. What's not to like?


If you would like to know more about what the morning involves, or what taking part requires, please ask us. We'll be sending out more detailed instructions closer to the event.

At that time the book was also ranked 19th in *Personal Transformation* and 16th in *Classic Coming of Age Fiction* in which category it was listed as the #1 Hot New Release.

Tim is active in the village, he directs the village choir, is a trustee of the Memorial Hall and is producing this year's *Kimpton Entertains*. He is a musician, performer, music teacher and organist at Lemsford Church. 'I've always dreamt of writing a novel,' said Tim, 'it's been quite a journey!'

All this whilst carrying the urn containing the ashes he must scatter on his late father's looming birthday. An urn that Nick would never have believed his life would come to depend upon. If only he hadn't lost it...

# Residents of Kimpton may recall that more than eight years have now elapsed since The White Horse closed its doors to the public. The building has been vacant and dilapidating ever since so... what's going on?

Brief History: The White Horse ("the WH") was closed by McMullens and sold to a property developer in 2015 who promptly applied to North Herts Council ("NHC") for planning consent to convert the building to a domestic dwelling. The "Save Our White Horse Community Group" ("the Community Group") was immediately formed to lobby for the retention of the pub and we successfully challenged the "change of use" request that had been submitted to NHC. Furthermore the pub was then registered by NHC as an Asset of Community Value ("ACV"). This was challenged by the developer and his objection was rejected at appeal. Having failed to achieve their aim of converting the pub to residential use, the property developer then offered the WH for sale in 2017. In order to bid for the pub, the Community Group obtained a professional valuation of the WH and, based on that advice, raised sufficient commitments for funds from villagers to place an offer to acquire the pub at market value. Unfortunately we were significantly outbid by the current owner who has remained in possession of the property ever since. Discussions have subsequently taken place between the owner and the Community Group regarding the future of the pub but no tangible action has resulted. Meanwhile the owner submitted a planning application in March 2021 which proposed the conversion of the majority of the WH to a domestic residence with a small element of the building set aside to incorporate a micro pub. It was clear that the micro pub neither served the interests of the community nor indeed was economically viable and hence that application was also dismissed following an overwhelming number of objections from villagers. The pubs protected status as an ACV was also extended for another five years to 2025.

Since the pub was sold in 2014 there has been no investment of funds to maintain the fabric of the building which is now suffering from dilapidation and, given the building's grade 2 listed status we, the Community Group, remain in dialogue with NHC to effect essential repairs.

Our Vision: The Save Our White Horse community group remains committed to retaining the WH as a village amenity. We are aware that some people argue that the village is not big enough to support two pubs but the evidence says otherwise. The number of pubs in Kimpton per head of population is only roughly half the national average and around half the average for the Hitchin and Harpenden Parliamentary constituency. Kimpton can easily support another pub provided that it offers the right service. Hence we have been working hard in tandem with professional advisors to draw up a business plan which quite clearly demonstrates the viability of the WH. Rather than compete with the existing pub in the village, we will diversify the offering of the WH to provide a complementary offer where our emphasis will be to:

Create a cozy, dog friendly, country pub with a cordial atmosphere to reflect our vibrant, welcoming, and sociable village.

Make the most of the 18c listed building in the High Street conservation area, with subtle ambient lighting, a warm log fire in winter and a sunny beer terrace in summer.

Provide a daytime café available for quality barista coffee, casual brunch, cakes, snacks, and a warm space in winter.

Serve local craft real ales, decent quality wine and other drinks, and locally sourced, quality pub food

Provide a destination for walkers and cyclists to "refuel" with coffee, cake, and café food after exploring the excellent local footpaths and cycle routes.

From page 18 To support our thoughts and ideas we have visited many of the community pubs around the country (many of whose start up challenges have reflected those of our own) to learn from their stories. Based on their experiences, and on professional advice received, we now have a viable business plan for the reinstatement of the WH where it is pertinent to note that less than 1% of all community pubs have ever failed.

Current Position: Whilst there appears to be no tangible progress as regards the reinstatement of the WH we hope the foregoing shows that there is a lot of work going on in the background to firstly protect the building and then to reinstate a traditional country pub serving quality local food and drinks. The Community Group has set up an incorporated company (a not for profit Community Benefit Society ("CBS") regulated by the Financial Conduct Authority), to hold the assets of the business. Under CBS rules, any surplus generated by the Society must be returned to the community or invested in the WH. Meanwhile we remain in discussion with all parties concerned, not least Bim Afolami (our MP), our District Councillor, NHC, Kimpton Parish Council and of course the current owner himself. Clearly the key to all of this is to obtain ownership of the pub but, whilst the owner has been willing to enter into discussions with us to sell the WH, we are unfortunately too far apart on price to agree a deal at present in line with its market value.


We are determined that the WH will not be lost to the Kimpton community and will continue to work hard to ensure that this amenity is returned to the community. order for the brass tablet which is to contain the names of all past vicars of Kimpton. They number 40." He says that "he has had their names and dates verified by one who is an authority on these matters." Sadly we don't know who did this job of authentication but we have depended heavily on their work for understanding the progression of the Vicars of our Church.

The magazine in those days was of a general nature, given to most parishes, with only the cover, adverts and one page of information relating to Kimpton itself. We have been very lucky though to be given copies of the July and August 1910 editions. We have never seen any before of this date!

If anyone has any old parish magazines, the Kimpton History Group would love to see them if you would allow us to.
