My last Sunday service at Ayot St Lawrence will be on 20th August at 11.30am and at Kimpton on 3rd September at 9.30am. Afterwards we'll celebrate the four and almost a half years that God saw fit to send me to serve you. Please come and celebrate with us. Save the dates!

And it has been an honour to serve here as well as a delight! I well remember the first evening we moved here and thirstily headed to the Boot—incognito without dog collar. We were so warmly welcomed, asked who we were. I took a deep breath and replied I was the new vicar. Usually, the temperature would drop a few degrees and the conversation be killed by such an announcement. Not a bit of it — everyone either introduced themselves as 'my flock' or were the baptism party still celebrating after the earlier event! Not for nothing was I later formally welcomed at my installation on behalf of both villages by the landlords of the Boot and the Brocket pubs and of course the Corner Stores! All three establishments have been endlessly and generously supportive of our churches here and I am so very grateful for their love and kindness.

My time here has been one of being embraced by the villages, villagers, congregations, groups, committees and of working with so many of you. And it didn't matter whether you are churchgoer or not; it is all about loving your neighbour and finding out what God has in store for you. If you join in, take part, are active in these villages we live in, then the rewards are great. Even as we all struggled together with the awful time of Covid-19 we came together in Kimpton Cares, with the Corner Stores deliveries, with Kimpton church as open as we dared for prayer, books, puzzles and food table –all because we care for one another. And you care for your village churches, your two big public spaces, with fund raising at the May Festival and Ayot St Lawrence Art Show Festival Fund. Thank you to all of you who have supported us in so many myriad ways. These are a wonderful couple of places to be.

So, the long hard goodbye has started for me. Someone said to me that saying good bye here is like the Eagles band's hit 'Hotel California'—the refrain-'you can check out but you can never leave!' I'm beginning to suspect that is true. Nigel and me will go with heavy but very grateful hearts for all we have enjoyed here. We shall miss all of you very much, but you will remain in my prayers.

Charlotte Manning sadly passed away after a battle with cancer on 31st March aged just 35. After a private funeral service at Harwood Park crematorium, a memorial service was held in a packed, 'standing room only' Kimpton church on 5th May. Charlotte was well known to Kimpton for her sterling work with the Kimpton Horse Show which she organised and ran superbly. Horses were her passion along with her husband Nick. It was only a year ago Charlotte married Nick Manning in her home village church of St James Thorley near Bishop's Stortford and began their married life on the High Street Kimpton.

Anne Marsh, of Church Lane, Kimpton, passed away after a very long struggle with ill health. Her private family funeral took place on 20th May in Kimpton Church.

Maureen Archer's cremated remains were interred in Kimpton churchyard last May 3rd. Maureen was a member of the wider Barnes family. For many years she lived on the Green, but she had lived in Sandridge since 1974. She now rests back in her home village of Kimpton alongside two of her sisters; Lilian Saunders and Margaret Barnes.

The ashes of **Mary Pearson White, widow of Peter White** was also laid to rest in Kimpton churchyard on 25th May alongside her husband.

Kimpton Autumn Show 2023

Do you like sewing (or sowing), growing, painting or creating? If the answer is "yes" to any or all of these, then the Kimpton Autumn Show is for you! Last year's Show was a really happy celebration of all that is best about Kimpton. We had lots of entries, many visitors, fun stalls and, of course, much tea was drunk and cake was eaten. This year will be the 45th Kimpton Autumn Show and we would like to make sure that everyone is welcome. So, hopefully, here are a few answers to some of the questions you may have about the Show...

When is it?

Saturday 9th September, 2023

Where is it?

Kimpton Memorial Hall

What happens on the day?

You bring your entries along between 9am and 10am. From 10am and 2pm, there will be no access as judging will be taking place and then, at 2pm, everyone is welcome to come and view the exhibits, enjoy the stalls, activities and refreshments. Finally, there is a sale of produce from 3.30-4pm.

Who can enter?

Anyone. Any age. There are special categories for Under-18s too – which are perfect for getting stuck into over the Summer holidays. The beautiful cover for the 2023 Autumn Show schedule was designed by Evie and there will be a competition again this year to design next year's front cover.

How much does it cost to enter?

Entry fees are 50p per class, except the Novelty Vegetables class and all the Under-18 classes which are FREE.

Is there a closing date for entries?

Yes. Entries need to be completed by Wednesday 6 September, although late entries (with double fees) will be accepted on 7 and 8 September.



How do I find out more about the different categories?

You can pick up a free Autumn Show schedule with details of all the different classes. Whether you love baking, preserving, growing, flower arranging, arts and crafts or photography, there is a class for you – including some new classes to look out for this year too. Schedules will be available from several places around Kimpton, such as Budgens of Kimpton, The Boot, the Church and the Dacre Rooms. They should be available from early July.

How many items can I enter?

As many as you like, although only one entry per class.

Do I need to be an expert?

Absolutely not! You will certainly be better than me with the current state of my broad beans. (With not-so-grateful acknowledgement to our local muntjac.)



An Update from Cllr Ralph Muncer

It's been over a year since you gave me the incredible privilege to serve as your District Councillor and I'm delighted to say that I've been making progress to deliver on the pledges I made to you in May 2022.

I have delivered on my promise to protect the Green Belt and Prevent Inappropriate Development from taking place in Kimpton, Peters Green and Blackmore End by voting to enhance and strengthen protections for the Green Belt Land which safeguards the countryside surrounding our rural community, and in order to prevent the Luton Airport Expansion I have taken a number of steps including lobbying both the Transport Secretary and the Aviation Minister to make them aware of the wholly negative impact any expansion would have on our community.

However, the issue of fly-tipping is one that is raised with me frequently and I want to make you aware of recent developments on an issue that disproportionately impacts rural communities such as ours in North Hertfordshire. Sadly, fly-tipping across North Herts is a record levels and between April 2022 and March 2023, 54 incidents were recorded in Kimpton. Yet the official figure from NHDC is a drop in the ocean when compared to the realities that both you and I witness as we walk and drive in our local area.

Unfortunately, it is highly likely we will see a further increase in fly-tipping as a result of the impending cuts to our bin collections, and this is a concern I have and will continue to highlight in the Council Chamber.

I welcome the decision by the Government to increase the maximum fixed penalty notice for fly-tipping from £400 to £1000, as well as publishing council league tables for fly-tipping which will increase transparency and improve accountability. It remains the case that individuals who are guilty of fly-tipping and prosecuted are liable to an unlimited fine and up

to 12 months in custody.

Farmers often find themselves victims of Flytipping and therefore I would like to draw attention to the Fly-tipping fund run by Hertfordshire Police and Crime Commissioner David Lloyd. This fund uses income from seizures under the Proceeds of Crime Act to clear and dispose of waste left on private land as well as providing advice and help to improve security.

If you would like assistance to access this fund or need help with anything else, please don't hesitate to get in touch.

- 4. Liaise with Hertfordshire County Council on the implementation of a 20mph speed restriction in Kimpton.
- 5. Regularly maintain Kimpton PC website and ensure that it complies with GDPR requirements.
- 6. Continue to have a presence on social media platforms to help increase communication with the community.
- 7. Complete hedgerow planting scheme around car park at Parkfield Sports Ground.
- 8. Encourage the community to get involved with climate change initiatives.
- 9. Review the organisation for Kimpton Christmas Market 2023
- 10. Review the condition of the access roads to Parkfield Sports Ground and Recreation Ground and instigate remedial works.
- 11. Review the condition of the roadway around The Green and instigate remedial works.
- 12. Support Kimpton Primary School and Kimpton Pre-School to ensure high quality education establishments are serving the children of the parish.
- 13 Liaise with developers on the construction of affordable housing for use by local people and key workers.

Kimpton Primary – a community school with the village at its heart

The school is very much of the community for the community and is lucky to occupy a large and well-resourced site. Visitors are often surprised at the size of our grounds hidden behind the High Street frontage.

Never one to stand still, the school is restless in its drive to constantly improve the school environment for the benefit of current and future pupils and others who may use the school site. We do our utmost to ensure that Kimpton Primary is the school of choice for those in the village and surrounding areas. If you know families who are looking for a local school, do make sure they know about us!

Educational funding continues to be a hot topic and the funds from government are sufficient (just!) to cover day-to-day operational expenditure but no more, so community plays an important part in enabling the projects the school has on its wish list. Projects completed in 2023 so far include:

- A new sandpit for the Early Years courtesy of the Bench Working Party.
- New playground equipment for the early years and a paint station for KS1, funded by North Herts Council, Kimpton Parish Council, May festival committee and a local business Switchshop
- Security fencing for the Early Years (using DfE capital grant)
- LED lighting throughout the school thanks to Switchshop



The governors of Kimpton Primary School are undoubtedly significant players in the school community and they have an important strategic role. We were especially proud of our Co-Chair of Governors, Josie Nicholson, who recently won the accolade of Governor of the Year from the Hertfordshire Association of School Governors. The achievement came with an award of £2,500 for the school which, along with the remaining money from Switchshop, is being put to good use to refurbish the former kiln room as a space for 1:1 speech and language interventions.

The PTA is a fantastic collaboration between parents and school and we are so fortunate to have a dedicated team of volunteers who organise a variety of social and fundraising events throughout the year. This year, a substantial donation from the PTA will be used to renovate and upgrade the outdoor play equipment for our older pupils in KS2. Through our links fostered with the wider community, the PTA funds have been bolstered by a donation from the local Kimpton Rugby group that will go towards a new playing surface on the playground and a new paths, making both areas safer for our children and ensuring we can proudly host home matches next season.

And, finally, of course, with the village at its heart, the school is delighted to participate each year in the Kimpton Festival and grateful to be a beneficiary of a portion of the proceeds.

We welcome opportunities for further interactions with our fellow villagers, so if you have skills, experiences or stories to share with us, we would love to hear from you. Or, if the school can help you, do get in touch – we have a spacious hall and playing field, both of which are available for hire outside school hours. Contact details are on the back page.

My grateful thanks to the Parish Council for coming to our rescue. We had been informed by RBL National that we were never meant to be organising the Remembrance Parade. We – and many other branches across the country - have been doing it wrong all these years! We had also previously had the support of the police who attended to ROYAL BRITISH LECION assist with road closures, but they are no longer able to

make that commitment. Apparently, it should be the Civic Authority that organises it as they have the necessary Public Liability Insurance. In addition, there must be an accredited company to deal with the necessary road closures. The Branch of the RBL must not be involved with applying for, or assisting with, a road closure. However, they are able to assist with the organising of the actual parade.

As you can imagine, this caused great disquiet within the Branch and much research into the problem to try to find a solution. However, after a lengthy meeting with the committee and attended by Andy Morton, Carina Helmn, and Ralph Muncer, the decision was taken to approach the Parish Council for help.

I attended their meeting on 24th May 2023 and explained our situation. Without their help, the parade could not and would not go ahead again. The Councilors agreed to underwrite the cost of the road closure, meaning that the Parade as we know it can go ahead. For this year, we have offered to try and provide some of the money ourselves- but it cannot be taken (quite rightly) from any monies raised for the Poppy Appeal. We will have a coffee morning in the Dacre Rooms on AUGUST 25th. The proceeds will go towards the cost of the road closure, thereby meaning the Parish Council are not required to pay the full amount.

We feel it is vital that our war dead are honoured and that the youngsters of the parish are involved in the service and parade so that the meaning of Remembrance lives on: -

> When you go home Tell them of us and say For your tomorrow We gave our today

With that in mind, our membership is dwindling. Remember -you do not have to have served in the forces to join. We intend to organise social events but need enthusiastic people to join us. We meet alternate months in the Boot. Please phone me if you would like a chat about joining.

Standing Up for Residents on Bin Collections

Bin collections are one of the most important services that North Herts Council provides. We all rely on a good bin collection service so that we can adequately manage our domestic

waste and to ensure that our area remains a clean, tidy place to live – somewhere we can all be proud of.

In my six years as your local Member of Parliament, that is the thing you have told me above all else – we are all incredibly proud to call the beautiful towns, villages and countryside that make up our corner of Hertfordshire home. It is a core tenet of my conservatism, that we should protect and enhance the communities where we live, so that we can continue to be proud of our area.

It is what motivates my campaign to protect our area from the threat of Luton Airport expansion. So that our villages and rural roads remain quiet, unpolluted, idyllic places to live and spend time.

It is what motivates my plan to expand the Chilterns Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty across North Hertfordshire. So that we can unlock new powers to protect and enhance our beautiful countryside, historic communities, ancient woodlands, rare chalk streams and rural way of life.

Conservatism isn't about conserving things just for the sake of standing still. It is about ensuring that progress is made in a way that captures the essence of our communities and that makes us *prouder* of the places where we live.

North Herts Council's plans to reduce general domestic waste collections from two to three weeks would not make North Hertfordshire into a better place to live. They would leave us with the worst bin collection rota in our region.

In the Council's own consultation, just 24% of

North Hertfordshire residents agreed that they would be able to manage their waste effectively with three weekly collections. Reducing bin collections would lead to overflowing bins and bin bags on the street. It would lead to public health concerns and vermin on our streets. And it would cause increased littering and fly-tipping.

All for a relatively minor cost saving – amounting to just over 2% of the money the Council receives from local people and businesses each year.

Working alongside your local Councillor Ralph Muncer, I want to make sure that our villages remain somewhere that we can be proud to call home. That's why, alongside the hundreds of residents who have backed our campaign, I'm calling on the Council to bin this cut, not cut the bins.

This little chap was underweight when we saw him in our garden and so we sought advice and he was taken away by an expert and restored to full health.

The Hornbeam Wood Hedgehog Sanctuary is a family run charity looking after wild British hedgehogs in Hertfordshire. The beautiful 10-acre property is perched on the hill above Harpenden and is dedicated to the care and rehabilitation of injured hedgehogs and orphaned baby hoglets found sick, injured or underweight.

Since its inception in 2013, founder Martin Maylin has rescued an astounding 1,500 hogs in his well known red hog

ambulance. In addition to continuously working on developing and improving the space for these prickly creatures, Martin hosts visitors to the sanctuary for education and awareness talks; offers popular corporate "giving back" days for teams, and is often seen at local market and fairs.

Martin's mum, co-founder Harriet manages the team of volunteers who create beautiful items for the onsite shop, help set up and man stalls at local fairs and markets, foster recovering hedgehogs, fundraise and help out at the sanctuary. "We are a fun group of hog-lovers and welcome any new volunteers to the team. You can help apply for grants, arrange events, take part in our arts and crafts making group, or give Martin a hand with some of his list of things to do,"says Harriet.
