An Update from Cllr Ralph Muncer

One of the most rewarding parts of my job as your District Councillor is speaking with local residents. That's why over the summer, I have been knocking on doors across Kimpton, Peters Green

and Blackmore End to hear your views on the main issues facing our community.

A number of issues have been highlighted to me which I have raised with Officers at the District Council, colleagues at County Hall and to our local Member of Parliament Bim Afolami. However, the two issues raised by me on the doorstep most frequently are potholes and the expansion of Luton Airport.

Potholes are not only frustrating to drivers but are dangerous and can lead to costly damage to vehicles if not repaired. Unfortunately, road surfaces across the country have sustained major damage this year as a consequence of the snow and ice during the winter months followed by heavy rainfall in the spring. This has resulted in more potholes and maintenance issues across Hertfordshire's 3,200 miles of roads and 3,500 miles of pavement and cycleways. However, due to nearly £4 million of additional funding from the Government's Pothole Fund, Hertfordshire County Council will now be able to repair 40,000 potholes across the County this year, as opposed to the usual 20,000.

This funding will make a real difference to our roads. However, I need your help. If you spot a pothole or highway fault, please report it by visiting: <u>https://www.hertfordshire.gov.uk/</u><u>services/highways-roads-and-pavements/report</u>-a-problem/report-a-highway-fault/what-type-of-fault-are-you-reporting.aspx . If you do not hear back from the council within 28 days, please let me know and I will check on the repair schedule and, if needed, request certain incidents to be prioritised.

As many will be aware, the Public Inquiry into whether Luton Airport should be granted a

Development Consent Order, paving the way for an increase in passenger numbers from 18 million per annum to 32 million per annum, recently began. Luton Airport continues to blight the lives of residents in Kimpton, whether it be noise coming from aircraft operations or the congestion which is caused on our roads and railways. Any expansion of the airport will only seek to exacerbate these issues, having a wholly negative and detrimental impact upon the lives of residents in Kimpton.

That's why I will continue to oppose any further expansion of Luton Airport, and once the Public Inquiry has concluded I will ensure you are kept updated with the latest developments. As ever, if you need any assistance, please don't hesitate to get in touch. Ralph Muncer

A village school – it's all about the people

In the school calendar, September marks the start of a new year. We are delighted to have welcomed to Kimpton Primary School this month not only new pupils but also their families, who we hope will play a long and active role in our community.

We are also thinking about our Class of 2023 and wishing them well as they start their secondary school careers ... but always with a little piece of Kimpton in their hearts; we trust we have prepared them well for this next step in their education. The destination for 70% of our Year 6 leavers was Katherine Warington School but Kimpton pupils have also gone to St George's School in Harpenden, Hitchin Boys' School, The Priory School in Hitchin, Townsend C of E School in St Albans and Egerton-Rothesay School in Berkhamsted.

The yearly exodus and influx of pupils is part and parcel of school life but we also celebrate the constancy that makes our community so special. This is a Good school and like all good businesses we know that our people are our greatest asset. Although the last three years have seen significant changes in the senior leadership team, we have a good track record of retaining staff – four of our staff have been at the school for over ten years, with a number of staff having had different 'hats' during their time with the school: Mrs Caner, whom many of you will know, was a SEN teaching assistant for five years before she found her niche in the school office; and Mrs Dollin worked for Herts Catering Ltd in our kitchen before she was persuaded to join the school staff as learning support assistant and Breakfast Club leader. It is also worth noting that nearly one in three staff are village residents.

This term we welcomed two new members to the staff team:

- Mrs Grey is the parent of children in the school but has now joined us as a Teaching Assistant, bringing a wealth of early years' experience that will aid the children's transition to Key Stage 1 she is already making a difference in Year 1.
- Mr Gifford first came to Kimpton Primary School as a 'Rock Steady' tutor and is a talented musician and sportsman – he did a placement here as part of his teacher training and we are delighted now to have him on board as an Early Career Teacher.

We are proud to support the next generation of teachers and now have teachers in their first, second and third years of teaching alongside more experienced colleagues. This breadth of experience is part of what makes the team so successful – we all learn from each other.

Our longest serving member of staff is Mrs Vine – she is a fixture at Kimpton Primary School, having been on the staff for over 30 years, now working with children of the children who were in her classes in the early days.



What made you choose to work at Kimpton Primary School?

"Working as a peripatetic music teacher across ten different schools on a weekly basis, I spent three years getting to know the children at Kimpton Primary. During that time, I came to look forward to each Thursday afternoon I would spend at the school due to the relationships formed with both the staff and children. Kimpton has always been a warm and inviting environment to work in and I was excited at the opportunity to continue my teacher journey with them" - Sam Gifford.

Backing Kimpton in Westminster

As a Member of Parliament, you play a lot of roles.

You tackle a wide and complex range of issues for your constituents – doing your best to resolve their particular problem. You spend lots of time debating national and international legislation – often having to learn quite niche and nuanced topics in great detail. You try to influence local policies – from bin collections to planning applications – over which you have no control and to varying levels of success.

Perhaps most importantly, you are a champion for your constituency and for all the myriad communities within it. In the months since my last

column for the Kimpton Magazine, I have been busy championing Kimpton's interests in Westminster.

This has included supporting the Parish Council's project to re-develop the pavilion on the Recreation Ground into a fantastic new amenity for residents. I think this is an excellent project and I was very happy to give them my full support.

I have written directly to the Secretary of State, Michael Gove, to endorse the Council's bid for funding from the Government's Community Ownership Fund and I hope that we will be able to secure the funds needed to deliver the new pavilion. Towards the end of July, I visited the Recreation Ground with Kimpton's District Councillor Ralph Muncer and we discussed at length how we can work together to support the project as it progresses.

I have also been working hard on a number of other campaigns which will benefit Kimpton. That includes my continued efforts to lobby the Department for Transport to stop Luton Airport's bids for any further expansion – recognising the impact that additional capacity would have on communities like Kimpton through increased air and noise pollution and traffic congestion.

I am also working to expand the Chilterns Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty across our local countryside – providing vital new protections for the character of our rural area.

Following our recent success in securing funding for a new specialist Cancer Hospital for our region, I am now working to make further improvements to local health services – including by delivering a new GP surgery to serve our communities.

Kimpton is a beautiful village, with a fantastic, vibrant community. I will continue to be your champion in Westminster. Bim Afolami



Hertfordshire OWL membership is currently 162,000 which includes Kimpton with 418 (48% of village households) but we want to improve on that. Fortunately this has been a quiet quarter but one recurring major issue relates to online and telephone crime :

The National Fraud Intelligence Bureau has published its annual assessment covering 2022-23 and its findings include

- Phishing emails continue to be the most common way frauds are started
- Hacking (Social media and email) is the top cyber crime type
- Online Shopping and Auction Fraud is the top fraud type, which means people are buying goods that possibly don't exist.
- Courier Fraud reports are DOWN but losses have INCREASED by 96%.

Across Hertfordshire we know residents are still being conned through telephone and online frauds, and the fraudsters can be persuasive, and manipulative.

If you receive a telephone call or email to say you are entitled to compensation, or you could help with a Police situation relating to your bank account, or your broadband / energy company / phone provider is giving you money back – it's likely to be the start of a fraud as the criminal will try to hook you with something that seems too good to be true. Any reputable company you do business with would have your postal address and would send you a letter about any money owing to you – they really wouldn't phone, text or email you.

If you, or a family member or friend has been a victim, please report to Herts Police by ringing 101 or through the online chat option (search for Herts Police Contact) and please forward any suspicious texts to Action Fraud at 7726 (spells SPAM on your keypad). Please report scams and attempted scams to Action Fraud.


