May the joy of the angels, the eagerness of the shepherds, the perseverance of the wise men, the obedience of Joseph and Mary, and the peace of the Christ child be yours this Christmas.




Kimpton has said its farewell to Tim Edwards who died in November.

# An Update from Cllr Ralph Muncer

There has been much talk in the media about the policy of 'levelling up', but what exactly is it all about? In short, it's about improving opportunities for individuals and supporting communities up and down the country.

That's why our local MP, Bim Afolami and I are delighted the Government has awarded our Parish Council with a grant of £62,000 towards the costs of refurbishing the Recreation Ground Pavilion, enabling it to be transformed into a community facility fit for the future.

But that's not the only investment from Government our communities will benefit from, as I'm pleased to report Hertfordshire County Council have been allocated nearly £88 million to improve our county's roads. This means we'll be able to fix more potholes across the County and I'll work to ensure the roads you and I use everyday benefit from this funding.

While the Public Inquiry into the Expansion of Luton Airport is currently ongoing, unfortunately the Airport has been given the green light to increase passenger numbers from 18 million to 19 million per annum. Although this is disappointing, I will continue to oppose the unnecessary and unsustainable expansion of the Airport which will have a wholly negative impact on our community.

A number of residents have contacted me about the impact of the District Council boundary changes and therefore, I hope the information below clarifies the situation.

In December 2021 Council decided it should move to all-out elections as opposed to the current model of elections by thirds. This means that from 2024 North Hertfordshire District elections will be held every 4 years, with Councillors elected for a 4-year term.

A Boundary Review has also taken place, the recommendations of which have now been approved by Parliament. As a result, 'Codicote and Kimpton' will form a single ward, represented by two Councillors on the District Council. This means on Thursday 2 May 2024, you will be voting for two Councillors as opposed to one. Finally, I would like to wish you and your family a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year and as ever, if you need any assistance please get in touch.

# Early Years Education - The foundation for all learning

The Early Years at Kimpton Primary School comprise our Reception and Nursery classes. Both follow the statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which has seven areas of learning and development:

- Communication and language
- Personal, social and emotional development
- Physical development
- Literacy
- Mathematics
- Understanding the world
- Expressive arts and design

From the term after their third birthday, all children are entitled to 15 hours' funded education – parents can use this in any early years setting; childminders, day care, preschools and nursery classes or schools.

### Why choose a nursery class?

Research shows that children accessing quality nursery education are given a head start to lifelong learning through carefully planned structured learning and child-initiated learning, with quality interactions from adults, and we therefore believe there are many advantages to choosing a nursery class in a school.

- Teacher-led education, supported by qualified early years practitioners, meaning the adults nurturing your children are specialists who know how to support them to reach their developmental goals.
- Builds confidence and independence.
- Develops social skills, with peers and slightly older children.
- Quality environment and resources, offering opportunities to explore many activities both indoors and out.
- Prepares children for school although the Nursery children have their own classroom, they share the outdoor space with the Reception children, so move seamlessly into Reception when it is time for them to start school.

# The Kimpton offer

We have a 26-place nursery and our core offer is from 8.45 - 11.45 am each weekday. However, working parents who are eligible for 30 funded hours can extend the day to 2.45pm. We are also able to accommodate fee paying pupils for lunchtime or afternoon session. In addition, children can stay for the period from 2.45 - 3.15pm on a paid basis, so that pick up coincides with any school age siblings.

# **New for January 2024**

From January, children will be able to start with us from the date of their 3<sup>rd</sup> birthday. We hope this will be a useful service for parents who might otherwise have enrolled with the Kimpton Preschool. Do get in touch if you would like more information about this.

It always seems very odd to be writing about May Festival with WPTON MAY FESTIVAL Christmas just around the corner but the planning for the 58<sup>th</sup> event has already started. If it wasn't for the pandemic we would be celebrating 60 years of May Festivals next year!

However, before getting on to the subject of the 2024 event – what did we do with the money raised in 2023?

The amount raised this year was an amazing £27,408 which includes £6,635 retained by the various groups who put on events and then gave the May Festival 50% of their profits. Therefore, with approximately £8,000 of expenses (it costs a lot to put on the festival), we are able to distribute approximately £12,700 to local groups and charities. This year's beneficiaries are:

Kimpton Parish Church Restoration Trust, Kimpton School, Kimpton Pre-School, Kimpton Players, Codicote Food Bank (supports Kimpton families), Kimpton Bowls Club, Kimpton Guides, Brownies & Rainbows, Kimpton Scout Group, Kimpton Garden Club, Kimpton Parish Magazine, The Willow Foundation, Herts Air Ambulance, Garden House & Isabel **Hospices and Keech Hospice Care.** 

As you can see, we are able to help and support a great many people thanks to the generosity and hard work of the residents of this village & beyond.

Now we look forward to the next Kimpton May Festival which will run from the evening of Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> to Monday 6<sup>th</sup> May 2024.

The theme will be "The Magic of Musicals" so now is the time to get your thinking caps on and come up with ideas for floats for the procession, entries for the fancy dress competition, what you might do for Kimpton Entertains or even the Dog Show! We look forward to seeing some imaginative interpretations of the theme.


Stocks of children's puzzles are again low so if you have any we would welcome them.

# Funding for Kimpton Pavilion redevelopment secured – and more wins for our community

When I wrote my last column for the Kimpton Magazine, I told you about the work we were doing to support Kimpton Parish Council's bid for Levelling Up funding to re-develop the pavilion on the Recreation Ground. In this column, I am absolutely delighted to be able to let you know that our efforts have paid off and Kimpton has been awarded £62k in Government funding for this project.

This is great news – and it shows that the Government's Levelling Up agenda really does have a material impact on communities like ours, with this fantastic local community-led project in Kimpton receiving game-changing funding.

And that's only one of a number of wins that we've seen over the past few months. You've told me how important it is to retain Day Travelcards and Ticket Offices are proposals were made to get rid of both. With the support of hundreds of people in our communities, I made representations to Government and to the Mayor of London (in the case of Day Travelcards), emphasising the importance of travelcards and ticket offices to easy, cheap and convenient travel for people in our area.

I am very pleased to be able to report back that our efforts have paid off, with both Day Travelcards and Ticket Offices being saved after the Government intervened.

In the run-up to Remembrance Sunday I also heard from constituents about a Thameslink policy that meant that the Royal British Legion and other charities were being prohibited from using their contactless card machines at local stations. I immediately wrote to Thameslink and they have agreed to change their policy – and I was pleased to hear that poppy sellers (and other charities, including Children in Need) were able to use their card machines to raise extra money for this fantastic cause.

Finally, on a personal note, you may have seen the news that the Prime Minister has asked me to serve as Economic Secretary to the Treasury. This is a really important role looking at a whole range of things, including financial services (a key local employer), regulation, fintech, crypto, and much more. At time of writing, I am getting stuck into my new brief as we look to deliver for people in Hitchin, Harpenden and the villages through the Autumn Statement!

In all my work, I'll continue to look after the interests of Kimpton alongside Cllrs Muncer, Thake and our whole local team. If you need my help on any issue, please do get in touch.

# After more than 12 glorious fun filled years, the Preschool is closing its doors at Christmas.

Over the past few months we have been astounded and deeply grateful at how the Kimpton community has stepped up to support us. The fundraiser and messages of support have meant the world to us, but now, sadly it's time to say goodbye.

The Preschool exists to serve one purpose. To start our youngest learners on their journey of discovery through play and education toward the world that awaits them at the school and well beyond.

However, the truth remains that without the children, there is a hole in our purpose, and that is not something that is new. The reality, as previously communicated, is that the number of children we have in sessions now and planned through to April is simply not sustainable for us. We have seen fewer children starting every year for the past 5 years. A slow drip effect of choices, commitments and competition that has made us more reliant on raising money or getting grants rather than through admissions which is the main way that we receive income.

We know there was talk of additional funds being pledged, but that would have required us to remain open to protect the investment. That was not something that could be done in good conscience as we knew that by the end of the school year it all would have been used, and then what would we do?

We cannot thank the people enough that have kept us going through their efforts. It's not just the bits that you may see - the fundraising and the leaflets and the staffing of the stalls. It's also those that help us manage the charity side, the business and finance side, the HR side; particularly over the past few weeks - and the level headedness when the decision needed to be made. They are all volunteers who give us their time whenever we ask, without question. We won't name them, but they know who they are, and we hope that our thanks here will be enough.

The future is not ours to decide, but we hear that there are a number of options being considered. A private nursery company takeover of the building, maybe a resource for the school – we don't know and would ask for your patience whilst those cogs turn. Just know that what we have built will not be forgotten.

As part of closing down the Preschool, we will be running a resources sale. We have lots of amazing, good quality equipment that can be sold or donated. We are particularly keen to support charities that support the thousands of children that are suffering so terribly in the current conflicts. We would also like to hear from you if you have contacts with any children's hospital wards or refuge centres that could benefit from toy donations.

As the Preschool is run as a non for profit charity, any money we raise will be donated straight back to where it should go; our Kimpton community. We will support the May Festival and Parish Council who have been so generous in their support to us over the years.

It has been an enormous privilege to be part of each and every child's Early Years journey over the years, we remember them all with pride and love.

Special thanks to our three magnificent Santas, Dave, Jim and Neil.



# Citizens Advice North Herts warns shoppers not to fall into seasonal shopping traps

New figures from Citizens Advice reveal the charity's national consumer service is contacted by worried shoppers every nine seconds, totalling an average of over 3400 a day. The service typically sees a spike in calls each

January as shoppers seek help after problems with Black Friday, Cyber Monday and festive purchases. The number of complaints received by the charity in January 2023 grew 28% compared with the month before.

### Does it seem too good to be true?

If it seems too good to be true — it probably is. This is especially true for products which are 'must-haves' or are sold out in major retailers.

Be wary of sites offering big discounts. Ensure that you're buying from the retailer's official website so that you know it's a genuine product. You can find out if a company is registered by searching their details on *gov.uk*. Sole traders (someone who runs their own business) and partnerships (where two or more people run a business together) don't need to register with gov.uk, so you'll need to do further research on their site to make sure they're a genuine seller

### Check you're buying from a trustworthy retailer

Do some background research into the company. Make sure you find their return and refund policies so you can understand your rights if something goes wrong with your purchase. Seeing what others say about the retailer can help you find out if it's a legitimate seller or not. But remember to look at reviews on other websites too, not just their official website.

### How do they want you to pay?

Be cautious when a seller asks you to pay by an unusual means such as in iTunes vouchers, crypto currency or via bank transfer. These are harder to track and lack the vital protections that you get when paying by debit or credit card or by a third party app such as PayPal.

#### If something you ordered hasn't arrived

If you've bought something from a business to be delivered, it's the seller's responsibility to make sure the item is delivered to you. If the seller used a courier, they should chase the courier to find out what's happened to your order - it's not your responsibility.

Hertfordshire OWL membership is currently 162,000 which includes Kimpton with 418 (48% of village households) but we want to improve on that. Please tell your friends and neighbours about it and urge them to join. Fortunately this has been a quiet quarter but one recurring major issue relates to online and telephone crime.

Across Hertfordshire we know residents are still being conned through telephone and online frauds, and the fraudsters can be persuasive, and manipulative. If you receive a telephone call or email to say you are entitled to compensation, or you could help with a Police situation relating to your bank account, or your broadband / energy company / phone provider is giving you money back — it's likely to be the start of a fraud as the criminal will try to hook you with something that seems too good to be true. Any reputable company you do business with would have your postal address and would send you a letter about any money owing to you — they really wouldn't phone, text or email you.
