Kimpton Retirement Village???

It may have slipped your notice that at Christmas the Kimpton Pre-School closed because of low numbers of children.

Any community depends on four pillars – a Church, a Shop, a Pub and a SCHOOL. Take away any of those bastions of community and the basic fabric starts to fall apart.

So what has caused this fall in numbers? Look around you. We now live in a village where the price of housing is way beyond the means of young families with young children. Houses have been extended way beyond their former size. New developments have been below the number that would require 'affordable' houses. The 'Ron Hyde Gap', which is an obvious place for building more houses, is not going to be built on because the plans were turned down for exactly that reason.

With more and more houses being sold in the village for over £1million, how is any young couple with school-age children to buy in Kimpton? Many who can afford the prices will have their children privately educated and not at our lovely and successful Primary School.

At the rate the numbers in the school are dropping we will be faced with a village of old and rich people with no children's voices, no Scouts, Guides, Brownies, Rainbows, Cubs and Beavers and fewer and fewer young adults to take over the running of the huge range of activities for which Kimpton is famous.

How can we stem this downward spiral?

- By encouraging more families to use our successful and exciting school.
- By drawing attention to this problem by writing to North Herts District Council
- By lobbying our MP Bim Afolami
- By considering, when making land available for development, whether to be generous enough to include affordable housing for the good of our lovely community.

Otherwise, our lovely Kimpton will simply become the Kimpton Retirement Village for old fogies like me! *Andy Morton*

Refurbishment of The Pavilion - building our future wellbeing Over the winter, Stellar Developments Ltd has made excellent progress with the internal stripping out and refitting with new heating, lighting, flooring, windows and doors. Internal decorating throughout is being

completed plus the addition of a new roof to keep everything dry! We're extremely excited to have watched the transformation - the finish is in sight!

Once Stellar are off site, our tenants will then be fitting out their areas to create a fully equipped fitness studio and cosy coffee shop. Months of planning has gone into transforming The Pavilion into a local health and wellbeing centre for all ages and all abilities and will complement the public open space of the Recreation Ground.

Kimpton Parish Council will be organising for the exterior cladding to be painted in April and security shutters fitted. With the help of many generous donations from clients of imPRovfit and members of Kimpton Rugby Football Club we will be installing a new defibrillator on the outside of The Pavilion.

Looking ahead The Pavilion will be used to provide public toilets at Kimpton May Festival and users of the Recreation Ground can hire the changing facilities.

An Update from Cllr Ralph Muncer

You work hard for your money and rightly expect your Council to provide highquality yet cost-effective services. Unfortunately, due to the decisions taken by the current Administration here in North Hertfordshire we are all paying more in Council Tax and getting less for our money.

From May 2025, residents across North Herts will be faced with the worst bin collection rota in the East of England.

It was announced in October 2022 that purple bin collections would be moving to a three-weekly collection cycle, and in December of last year the Administration voted in favour of further 'Service Design Changes' which will result in a number of cuts to service provision including:

- Three weekly collection of mixed paper and cardboard in a new bin for most households, and three weekly collection of the remaining mixed dry recycling glass, plastic and cans, with the addition of plastic bags and wrapping,
- Removal of approximately 30% of litter bins from across the district,
- Increasing response times for missed bin collections from 17:00 the next working day to 72 hours,
- Reducing the number of items collected as part of a bulky waste collection from 6 to 3,
- Removing dedicated seasonal leaf-fall management and a reduction in street cleaning.

If you subscribe to the Garden Waste Service, this will still be collected every two weeks and Food Waste will continue to be collected every week.

Like you, I'm deeply concerned about these plans, not least the impact they will have on households in our community. That's why I have called on the Administration to scrap these cuts and focus on delivering the high-quality statutory services you expect and deserve.

As you may be aware, on Thursday 2 May you will be voting for two District Councillors for the 'Codicote and Kimpton' Ward. Regardless of which two candidates you will be supporting, in order to have your say you must be registered to vote. It takes 5 minutes to register, and you can do it here: <u>www.gov.uk/register-to-vote</u>. Please also be aware that you now need to show Photo ID at the Polling Station in order to cast your ballot." *Best wishes, Ralph*

Come rain or shine



There is much evidence that being out in the fresh air can promote emotional wellbeing and, whatever the weather, Kimpton Primary School **PRIMARY SCHOOL** children can be found enjoying the great outdoors.

The school's investment in outdoor learning has continued apace and we are fortunate to have been assisted along the way with grants from Learning through Landscapes, Feeling Good Week (a Hertfordshire-wide event), and Kimpton Parish Council.

You may have read about Forest School - an initiative that has its roots in Scandinavia but which is now prevalent in many UK early years settings and schools. In the words of the Forest School Association, it is "a child-centred, inspirational learning process [...] that supports play, exploration and supported risk taking". This is something we have long wanted to bring to Kimpton and we were able to set aside some reserves this year to kick-start our Forest School Journey.



We have built a fire pit area to the western edge of the main playground, where children will be able to take part safely in camp fire activities.

Then, with monies generously provided by the Parish Council, we have been able to erect a large shed to house our expanding collection of outdoor learning resources. As you will see from the photo, it is magnificent. Our landscapers laid a shingle path to the door and, in due course, we hope this will be framed by wild grasses and flowers.

To the front of the school, work has commenced on our community garden. In due course, we are hoping that this will become a whole-village affair, so watch this space!

Learning through Landscapes, the UK's leading

outdoor learning and play charity, provided us with resources to the value of £500, and we used this to acquire three large planters and some lesson planning guides. LtL also sent a trainer to deliver some inspirational training to get us started and we will be continuing to work with this organisation next academic year. The Bench Party is now hard at work to build some additional planters for us and we will be using these to plant herbs and vegetables.

Through Feeling Good Week's Regrown Grant, we have been able to purchase a composter, butterfly house, wild insect hotel and hedgehog house, as well as a 2-seater bench and some smaller items.

Elsewhere, the pond is now well established and the children love to go pond dipping.

We are excited for spring!

A Budget that delivers for Kimpton

This year I am thrilled to be your May Queen and hope to see you all there!





Most people have heard of the Royal British Legion, but have you ever wondered what your contributions help with?

They assist both serving personnel, or those who have previously served. Here are just a few examples.

<u>Expert rehabilitation</u> **The Battle Back Centre Lilleshall** in the West Midlands, was established by the Royal British Legion in 2011 to support wounded and injured service personnel returning from Iraq and Afghanistan. It now provides recovery and rehabilitation support to currently serving and ex-service personnel who are wounded, injured or sick . In addition , they have expanded their service with the introduction of wellbeing courses for veterans. 7,137 Serving or ex-serving personnel have attended the centre since it opened.

<u>Care Homes</u> there are six care homes across the country- five with specialist dementia care- for the armed forced community and their families. Specifically designed for veterans and their families, there is also a unique camaraderie, and the residents often establish strong friendships and bond over their shared experiences.

Last year the RBL Provided **793** residents with dementia care.

<u>Tackling Money Problems</u> The RBL help to ease the burden of financial pressure for thousands of serving and ex-serving personnel every year. Their financial team provide specialist compensation advice, help with debt and emergency situations, and can provide support through grant applications.

The benefits and money advice team can help with managing finances and also support you if someone is experiencing financial problems.

Last year 37,341 people received expert financial guidance and support.

The RBL also provides employment advice, accommodation advice, advice on how to live independently, how to set up a business and access to various courses.

Kimpton Groundwater Levels

The Environment Agency has issued a flood alert for Kimpton as the groundwater levels have continued to rise following recent rainfall. They monitor groundwater levels in Kimpton using data from the Lilley Bottom Observation borehole. You can view more information about the flood alert here: <u>Flood alert for Groundwater flooding in Kimpton and Lilley Bottom - GOV.UK (check-for-flooding.service.gov.uk)</u>

The alert indicates a possible risk of groundwater flooding in the coming weeks and months.

Hertfordshire County Council are organising multiagency meetings with North Herts Council, Environment Agency, Thames Water and attended by the Parish Clerk, in accordance with Kimpton Level Action Groundwater Plan. We would like to reassure residents that we are closely monitoring groundwater levels, sharing information and will ensure a coordinated and timely response to you regarding any future developments.

September to December 2023 was wetter than equivalent in 2020 but Jan 2024 was drier and so delayed the groundwater rising. (please see graphs below)

Groundwater levels are also monitored by North Herts Council at the '*Claggy Road sump*' to provide the data on the local situation.


What do you think? Fencing or no fencing around the play area at the Recreation Ground?



A Blossoming Future: The Creation of Parkfield Meadow



In the heart of Kimpton, a transformation is underway, thanks to the vision and dedication of Sue Davies and a supportive community. With wildflower meadows across the UK vanishing at an alarming rate – a staggering 97% since the 1930s – the ecological impact has been profound, particularly on our vital pollinators and insects. Recognising the urgency of this loss, Sue proposed the creation of a wildflower meadow within our village, a suggestion that found enthusiastic approval from the Parish Council.

Parkfield Green was selected as the site for this project and has already seen Sue and a team of committed volunteers undertaking the preparatory work necessary for the meadow's establishment. This includes pruning trees, scarifying grass, and sowing a carefully chosen seed mixture from Emorsgate Seeds, a company specialising in native wild seeds. The mix, designed to promote biodiversity, consists of 20% wildflower and 80% grass seeds, including 27 wildflower species and five grass types.

This initiative has been made possible through the support of Kimpton Parish Council and the hard work of the Working Bench Party and other friends of Parkfield Meadow. Among the wildflower varieties soon to be seen in the meadow are cowslips, red campion, ox-eye daisies, self-heal, vipers bugloss, crested dog's-tail, and common bird's-foot trefoil. The latter is particularly noteworthy for its role as a food plant for 160 species of insects, which, in turn, support numerous birds and mammals.

While the newly sown plants in Parkfield Meadow may take some time to establish fully, we are encouraged to be patient, allowing this new habitat the time it needs to flourish. Once established, Parkfield Meadow will serve as a vibrant living classroom and sanctuary, showcasing the importance of biodiversity and ecological balance.

This project is a testament to what can be achieved when a community comes together, inspired by a shared vision of environmental stewardship and sustainability. Parkfield Meadow promises to be a source of pride and joy for Kimpton, a place where nature thrives, and the community can gather to enjoy the simple beauty of a wildflower meadow. Let us all support this fantastic initiative and watch eagerly as it grows into a legacy for future generations. *Nigel Dowse*

The KPG is a member of the CPRE (Council for the Protection of Rural England) In recent years there has been little KPG activity and we have not held a meeting for some years, our secretary and chairman are in their 80s and our treasurer recently died. We are asking if there is any support to continue with the KPG and if so are there any volunteers willing to take on management of the KPG. Please let our current secretary know if you are interested. If there is no significant village wish for the KPG to continue, then the group will fold and our funds of around £120 will be donated to the CPRE (as stated in our constitution)
