#### Another new defibrillator in the Parish

The case for defibrillators is compelling with a long-PARISH COUNCIL term ambition of ensuring that the whole parish is covered reducing the time to access a unit in an

emergency. These devices are now widely available and increasingly used by people, often with little or no training, to re-start the heart of a victim of Sudden Cardiac Arrest. Survival rates for cardiac arrests improve significantly when defibrillation can be administered to a patient inside five minutes of the onset of a cardiac event.

We're delighted to let you know that a defibrillator for Blackmore End has been purchased and is being fitted this month. Cllr Simon Davies organised community funding through Go Fund Me and a magnificent £1455.34 was raised, 65% of the costs. The defibrillator will be located on the road facing garage wall of 49 Beech Way, which is conveniently located to Kimpton Road. We are very grateful to the resident for hosting this life-saving piece of equipment ready for public use.

This Automated External Defibrillator (AED) joins the network of defibrillators in the parish; all the same model 'Life-Line View'.

As the Community Heartbeat Trust says "No one will criticise you for trying to save a life! The defibrillator will not function unless it determines there is a need, so do not worry about using one!"



As the current concrete surface is not suitable for the traditional lines of a netball court, we are looking at shooting spots and other markings. Turn to page 6








*From page 5* In design the netball markings are placed circles and will have numbers to add a scoring part to the game. All the circles are within the 4.9m D shaped shooting area that is on a normal netball court. A netball net will be on a new post to the side of the basketball post. The basketball markings are from the 3 point line for shooting and also the key markings with the short lines, the basketball can also benefit from using the netball markings too.

For the adjacent concrete runway area, we are considering putting down some play markings like a trail. Another suggestion to encourage active play is the painting of a five a side pitch on the Recreation Ground, as used in May Festival Children's Football competition. Would this be welcomed?


#### **Groundwater Flooding**



#### An Update from CIIr Ralph Muncer



Standing for election is an incredibly humbling experience, even more so is being re-elected as your District Councillor. I would like to take the opportunity to thank all those who supported me on Thursday 2nd May, and over the next few years I'm looking forward to working hard to deliver on what matters most to you and your family.

I recently joined Bim Afolami for a meeting in Parliament with Aviation Minister Anthony Browne, along with Civil Servants from the Department of Transport to discuss the impact of Luton Airport on our community.

Bim and I highlighted a number of concerns surrounding noise pollution and the oversight of Airport Operations. With the Airport being owned by Luton Borough Council, the Council has no incentive to enforce breaches of noise regulations and has consistently shown a complete disregard for local communities such as ours. We urged the Minister to review oversight and accountability for Airports that are owned by Local Authorities, and pressed the Department for Transport to directly monitor noise levels at Luton Airport.

Following the Kimpton Flood in 2001, which predominantly impacted Claggy Road and the High Street, the Local Authority installed a sump to monitor groundwater levels in the area.

With the second wettest winter on record for Hertfordshire, groundwater levels are currently high, and whilst levels should start to recede during the summer, the increased risk of flooding is something residents should be aware of. I'm receiving briefings from Officials at both Hertfordshire County Council and North Hertfordshire District Council who are continuing to monitor the situation, and whilst I will endeavour to keep you informed of any developments, I would advise local residents to use the link here to see if the Environment Agency have issued a flood alert for our area: check-for-flooding.service.gov.uk

### What is a school?

The Oxford Learner's Dictionary describes school as "a place where children go to be educated". "To be educated" means having learned a lot PRIMARY SCHOOL at school or university and having a good level of knowledge. But, in schools, we know that education is so much more than knowledge. The

DfE currently has a big drive towards improving attendance in schools and recognises that being in school is important not only to a child's academic achievement, but also their wellbeing and wider development. Schools are places where children learn, socialise and somewhere they can be safe

At Kimpton Primary School, we look at our pupils holistically and ensure that Every Day Counts. We want each to achieve their full potential and, to do that, we provide the broad and balanced curriculum that the DfE requires and then add enrichment opportunities and offer enhanced experiences outside of the classroom - these include offsite visits and visitors coming in to school.





As I write this at the end of May, we have just waved Year 5 off on their school journey to Barton Turf - a sailing school and adventure activity centre in the Norfolk Broads. It won't be long before Year 6 get their turn and spend a week in a residential and outdoor activity beside a Norfolk Of course, we wouldn't be able to offer Beach. these without or wonderful staff who sacrifice spending time with their own families to look after the pupils. Although we are conscious of the rising costs of such trips, we feel the benefits are enormous. For some children, it will be the first time they have spent time away from their parents and the school journey is a first step towards The trips promote resilience and independence. other personal and social skills: we see children developing confidence and self-esteem as they take on new challenges and often achieve things they hadn't dreamt they were capable of, and pupils who perhaps struggle in the classroom setting come into their own. It is a time for making memories and building relationships - with peers and also with

between children and teachers; seeing people in a different environment breaks down barriers.

Lower down the school, the children have day trips to look forward to. This year, Nursery, Reception and Year 1 will be going to see the animals at Whipsnade Zoo. Meanwhile, Years 2

and 3 are off to Knebworth House, with a Science focus - to understand what plants need to grow and to be able to name different types of plants and plant parts; they will also be practising counting in multiples of four!

We have had visitors in school for Science Week; we have a mobile planetarium in the hall; Nursery hatched some ducklings, there have been African drumming workshops and we welcomed the Tally Ho Project in to talk to the children about the Battle of Britain and the extraordinary lives of some of the individuals involved.



#### imPRovfit Coaching Health and Fitness

Circuit Training returns to the Recreation Ground for Summer. It's a glorious setting to train in. Sessions are strength-based with elements of cardio and core training. You come away from every session having had a full-body workout. The training is suitable for all fitness levels and abilities.

#### imPRovfit Challenge

Small group PT sessions launched in the fitness studio at the end of April. The feedback has been fantastic, with all 8 ladies thoroughly enjoying the sessions. Each week the goal is to progress specific exercises using free weights and cable machines, to build strength and muscle tone. Everyone is embracing the challenge to get maximum benefit from every session.



'I had such a good time this morning, and was completely energised for the rest of the day! I always find machines in the gym intimidating, but now I know there is nothing to be scared of!'

#### imPRovfit Active

Small group sessions (5 ladies and gents) for older adults started in the fitness studio in May. It's been great to support them as they embrace learning new exercises that build strength and maintain lean muscle mass. Here's what they had to say about the sessions:

' Having tried other classes at gyms I always end up stopping as the trainers do not take age or ability into

consideration. Whilst Pippa's classes are challenging, each individual is encouraged to work hard at their own level and within their own capabilities. She works all areas of the body with great warm ups and warm downs. 'I was made to feel very welcomed and relaxed by Pippa. Sessions are taken at the pace of each individual and tailored according to ability. Pippa is motivational, positive, and able to explain movements very clearly. She is also very good at following up to check how we are all feeling. Really enjoyable sessions!' In response to demand, a second imPRovfit Active is being added to the weekly timetable.

#### The Importance of Protein in Our Diet

Protein is a macro nutrient, and is essential for growth, repair and maintenance of our organs, muscles and antibodies in our immune system. Protein is crucial for anyone aiming to stay fit and healthy no matter what their age.

#### **Benefits of Protein**

- 1. Muscle Repair & Growth: Essential for recovery, repair and development after exercise.
- 2. Reduce Age-Related Sarcopenia (Muscle Loss): maintaining muscle mass as we age.
- 3. Enhanced Performance: Supports muscle strength and endurance.
- 4. Weight Management: Helps control appetite by promoting feelings of fullness.

#### How Much Protein Do You Need?

The current Recommended Dietary Allowance (RDA) for protein is 0.8 grams per kilogram of body weight. Individual daily intake depends on weight, height, goal and level of physical activity. Research suggests 1.2 - 2.2 grams per kilogram of bodyweight is optimal. Consume protein from diverse sources and distribute intake evenly through the day, in each meal and snack. Consuming protein post-workout, within 30 minutes to an hour, can enhance muscle repair

- Lean Meats, Fish and Seafood Chicken, turkey, lean beef, Salmon, tuna, shrimp.
- Eggs and Dairy: Eggs are versatile and nutrient-dense; milk, yogurt, cheese.
- Plant-Based, Nuts and Seeds: Beans, lentils, tofu, quinoa, almonds, peanuts, chia seeds.

### A 'Thin' Space

In a recent TV programme about 'Pilgrimage', someone described certain places as 'thin' spaces – places where the gap between earth and heaven seems very thin and you could almost feel that you could reach out and grasp whatever lies on the other side. Sometimes those are structures, like churches, mosques and temples. Sometimes they are places of natural beauty. Recently, we were in the Lake District and the view from the National Trust property at Brantwood, looking across Coniston Water to the mountains leading up to Coniston Old Man and the Langdale Pikes was just the sort of place I might describe as 'thin'.



For many people, our church is another 'thin' place. It is a place of refuge, where we can go to think, perhaps to pray, when times are complicated. It's a place of reassurance and tranquillity in our turbulent world, and you don't need to be a believer in any sort of religion to find strength and calm from a visit there. Plenty of times I have gone into the church to find someone just sitting quietly for a few minutes. They aren't there for a service. They come for their own reasons, which they may wish to share, or they may wish to keep to themselves. Sometimes they are from faiths other than Christianity, and that's fine too. That building is for the whole community. It is a resource. It is like a torch battery, where one can tap into a sense of peace and go out recharged.

Maybe you have your own 'thin' place, where you feel at peace and can recharge your batteries. Make sure that you visit it regularly!

#### Ukraine Appeal June 2024

For 18 months now Kimpton has been supporting Ukraine through ALFS, a small charity who have set up as safe a route as possible, to get donations to locations in Ukraine including a premature baby unit, schools (often underground), small communities and the front line. Tina Banks who leads this charity has visited many of the destinations and photographs of them and reports can be found on <u>www.alfsherts.com</u>.

Each month or so a new list of requests is issued. We collect donations in the parish Church in a large plastic box on the left of the main door, behind the font. They are collected and taken to the main collection point. The full list is on the box but I am concentrating here on the SOS message:

"DOCTORS on the front line have sent us a list for the special needs of men and women working there.

<u>Cooking/heating</u> Generators, Jetboil stoves, gas camping stoves, gas cylinders. Power banks.

<u>Food</u> Instant food (e.g. dried pasta), energy drinks & bars, chocolate, coffee, tea, sweets, canned meat & fish, food for long term storage.

<u>Medicines</u>: dates don't matter. Especially for fever eg Ibuprofen, for colds, painkillers, blood pressure, tourniquets, bandages.

<u>Toiletries:</u> wet wipes, dry body wash, dry shampoo, detergents, sanitary wear for women, mosquito repellent, liquid soap.

<u>Clothing:</u> work overalls, tactical gloves and elbow pads and knee pads and glasses, green or black T shirts, underpants, socks, army boots

<u>Tool kits,</u> axes, saws, picks and shovels. (these do not need to be new but in working order)

Other: stretchers (frameless), sleeping bags. "

I would like to express my deep gratitude for the way Kimpton has responded to the Appeal over the last 18 months. There is desperate need and Kimpton has responded to it. Thank you.


